The December 18, 2020 ZOOM meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order at 12:30pm by Norma Treadwell, Co-President, who welcomed all who were present and confirmed a quorum. The minutes of the Board meeting held on October 23, 2020 were approved as submitted.

ELECTED OFFICERS' REPORTS:

Co-President Report: Sandi L. thanked Sue Hammer and Princess Ferguson for the informative ZOOM Public Policy Committee meeting. AAUW's Janet Bunger is go-to person for information.

1st Vice President's (Program) Report: Cathy Veal noted that today's ZOOM General Meeting will begin at 2pm today. The program for the meeting will be "Pandemic Curses and Blessings."

2nd Vice President – Membership: Diana Bagwell reported on comments received so far from calls to our membership. Most people enjoyed the contact. Info received so far indicates that 29 of our members (21 members, 8 board members) have been involved. Barb and Diana will look into further contact of members.

Operating Accounts Manager's Report: Margi Rex not present at this meeting. Sandi reported receipt of a check from a former member. Money will be given to Margi.

Fundraising Accounts Manager's Report: Anne Goff reported 25 donations totaling \$3090 were received in the 2020 Matching Challenge, for a total after matching of \$5,110. Sue Hammer moved and Diane Harrison seconded a motion that \$3090 will go to the BRCC Educational Fund. Motion carried. Norma directed Anne to write the check for \$3,090.00 and send to Lisa at BRCC with a letter copying Sandi and herself.

Committee Reports:

Public Policy: Sue Hammer reported her committee had a productive ZOOM meeting. Discussed local schools and what is now going on with the COVID crisis. Many kids will lose a year in terms of effective learning. There is also need for Medicaid expansion. It was suggested that Cong. Cawthorn be informed about AAUW efforts. Sue Hammer attended a state public policy meeting. Dr. Mattox is the chair of the state committee. Nine women attended the meeting from around the state. Sue reported that seven branches in North Carolina are closing, including the branch in Tryon. It was suggested that we should ask members of the Tryon branch to join our branch. Norma will contact them.

Newsletter: Susan Huff noted that the deadline for newsletter entries is 12/28. She said she may mail the newsletter for the first of the year issue to get everyone's attention.

Interest Group Coordinator Barbara Beckerman mentioned increasing book club members. This is the usual time of year to get things started in interest groups.
