The September 22 kick-off program, "Celebrate Leadership" consisted of a panel of three prominent Hendersonville women: MaryShell Zaffino, MD, chief medical Officer of Blue Ridge Health; Mayor Barbara Volk; and Ruth Birge, former publisher of the Times-News and subsequently Executive Director of the United Way of Henderson County.

The panelists responded to a series of probing questions posed by moderator, Princess Ferguson. Among the topics to which the women responded were: What obstacles to leadership did you encounter? What is your leadership style (and how does it differ from a man's)? How have you been able to balance the demands

of family and career? and Who was your inspiration/mentor and how do you mentor women coming up? The answers were fascinating in their diversity as each women told her story of coming to a leadership position, finding her stride, and sharing her hard-won

knowledge and success with other women.

Following the panel, Hendersonville's newly named Legacy of Leadership Awards for 2020 and 2021 (awarded at this time due to Covid) were made to Diana Bagwell—2020 and Cathy Veal—2021. The criteria for these awards is "furthering the AAUW mission and making a significant/sustained contribution in support of the program and goals of the branch." Each woman received a certificate indicating that a contribution had been made in her name to Blue Ridge Community College scholarship fund.

Celebrating Our 45th Year - Commitment to Equity

Since its inception, the Hendersonville Branch has been recognized for its generosity in funding AAUW programs such as Work Smart, Money scholarships for local women. Knowing that education increases economic security for women, we've contributed over \$60,000 to Blue Ridge Community College (BRCC) students.

In April, 1993 we started the AAUW Hendersonville Scholarship Restricted Fund with BRCC with \$500. The Scholarship is awarded to a secondyear female student who maintains a 2.5 grade point average and plans to pursue a four-year degree. Financial need is also considered.

In February, 2018, we established the **AAUW Hendersonville Scholarship Endowment** at BRCC with a \$10,000 gift from the Estate of member Helen Somerville. The Endowment has the same criteria as the Scholarship Fund. 4% of the Endowment's assets are awarded yearly as long as the assets are above \$10,000. Since 2019, we have funded 10 students. For 2022-23, \$3500 will be awarded from the combined restricted and endowment funds.

Another source of scholarships from our branch is a Donor Advised Endowment Fund created in May, 1994 with the Community Foundation of Henderson County. With current assets of \$15,201, the purposes of the Fund is "To meet the charitable objectives of the (branch) which includes but is not limited to scholarships." That means, for example, if the branch were to determine a specific project that needed financial support, the Fund could also be used for that purpose.



We also are committed to funding national Smart, STEMEd for Girls, NCCWSL, Community Action Grants and more.

An annual contribution to AAUW Funds is made possible by the generosity of a past branch president. In April, 1998, the Kathleen L. Ehlers Memorial Fund was established "to provide annual support to the Hendersonville Branch of AAUW to assist the branch in carrying out its obligation to make an annual gift to the Educational Foundation (now AAUW Funds) of the Association (now National). The income from this Fund will be paid in perpetuity to the AAUW Funds. Our contribution for the 2022-23 year was \$625.

Money Smart The AAUW Money Smart program is aimed at providing all women with the personal finance information they need to ensure their own economic security.

Work Smart This program focuses on how to negotiate for a new job, pay raise or promotion.

STEMEd for Girls is a series of lively, informative and engaging virtual workshops that will pave the way for success as girls move through high school, into college, and eventually on to their careers.

NCCWSL (say nic whistle) Each year, hundreds of college women from around the country come together for three days of leadership training, inspiration and networking at our National Conference for College Women Student Leaders.

Be proud of the impact your financial generosity has made on the lives of women and girls for 45 years!
