The Founder of Tierra Fértil, a Hispanic, worker-owned farm cooperative in Hendersonville and ABUNDANCIA, a food bank providing fresh food, Delia's story is one of hope and community.

According to the Community Foundation of Henderson County, 10.7% of the population in Henderson County faces food insecurity.

# Tour Time Citizen Vinyl Tour & Lunch at Session Café

Citizen Vinyl is housed in the historic Citizen Times building which is considered Asheville's finest example of Art Moderne design. Seeped with history, the dramatic first floor was transformed by Citizen Vinyl in 2019 into a vinyl record pressing plant, a bar/café and record store. Additionally, they restored the third floor radio station studio into a modern analog recording studio and media lab.
